We are writing to request that, as soon as the immediate public health emergency subsides, Congress and the Administration initiate a highevel, comprehensive review of the COMP response through either a federal commission or a qualified, nonpartisan entity such as the National Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine. This process should also be forward and make crossutting recommendations on how the United as can better prepare for future public health emergencies, including funding needs and policy changes.
